## Who are Camps with Meaning?

**CAMPS WITH MEANING** (CwM) is the Camping Ministry of Mennonite Church Manitoba (MCM). Camps with Meaning serves the MCM congregations and the larger community through facilities and programming (Camp Assiniboia and Camp Koinonia).

In our summer programming we reach out to kids and youth, as well as adults with mental and physical disabilities, from across Manitoba: inner-city to rural. We invite campers to a fun-filled week new experiences, relationship-building and chances to both learn about Jesus' life and experience it. At Camps with Meaning, we are connecting campers to the Creator, to community, and to creation.

#### **Summer Program Goals**

We ask all our summer staff to help create an atmosphere conducive to:

- ...discovering and nurturing of a meaningful relationship with Jesus and the Spirit of God,
- ...affirming the worth of self and others, as well as developing skills in community living.

...developing an appreciation for the Creation, learning responsible stewardship of it, and responding in worship to the God who created it.

## **Application Checklist**

- 2 Reference Forms will be attached to your confirmation email.
- Child Abuse Registry Check (CAR)

Bring 2 pieces of ID when handing in your application or at your interview (SIN, Band/Status #, Passport, Birth Certificate, MHSC, and/or Driver's License). A form will be available to fill out at your interview as well.

• Criminal Record and Vulnerable Sector Check (CR)

Complete a criminal record check (with vulnerable sector screening) at your local police or RCMP station (or <u>online</u>, if you are over 18, using agency name "Mennonite Church Manitoba") You will need two pieces of ID and a means of payment. You can send in a copy of a recent Criminal Record check if you have had one done for another job (within the last year).

#### PLEASE NOTE!

#### Your CAR and CR checks are good for 3 years if you work consecutive summers. Please check with the office (204-895-2267) if you are unsure when your last checks were submitted.

• Financial Support

<u>CwM Sponsorship</u>: The training week is a volunteer week, and CwM will pay for half of the remaining weeks you work at camp. You will be asked to fill out New Hire and TD forms to be put on payroll and receive these wages through direct deposit.

<u>Home Church Sponsorship</u>: Have a conversation with your church asking if they are willing to support you financially in your camp ministry for the remainder of your weeks.

<u>Other Sponsorship</u>: Staff who cannot be paid by their home congregation will be paid, as possible, through CwM Staffership Fund with donations from MCM churches. A connection with a church will be made and some communication on your part will be encouraged.

Rate for 2025: \$505/week, but likely more (depending on grants received in early 2025).

### 4 Month Schedule

For the most part, leadership positions require a commitment to four months (May-August). However, we recognize that there are particular situations that would prevent applicants from being able to commit to the full duration (i.e. courses, traveling, previous commitments, etc.). Hiring decisions will be made based on a combination of these factors: qualifications, suitability to job description, duration of commitment, experience, and maturity, among others.
